Reading books

We actively encourage children to read widely at home and at school. This does not necessarily need to be the children's school reading book (which the children are able to change for themselves). Children should be encouraged to follow their literary interests. We do ask that the children keep a record of what they have read and when in their Reading Logs.

Uniform

- Black trousers or skirt

- White or blue polo shirt.

PE Kits

Homework

Children can also work through their homework with me over lunchtime.

Spellings will continue to be sent home every Friday for your child to be tested on the following Friday. We will explore the spelling rule and practice daily in school; however, we do encourage this at home too.
