

PE Kits

Year 6 will be participating in PE lessons on a **Monday** afternoon with myself, and **Thursday** afternoon with the First Step Sports coach. Children should continue to bring their PE kits on a Monday and leave them in school until Friday. Children should wear a plain t-shirt in their relevant house colour with black shorts or jogging bottoms. Children with ear piercings should bring tape to cover their ears, if your child cannot take the earrings out. Depending on the weather, some of the PE lessons will be outside so children will need trainers and perhaps a warm sweatshirt.

Reading books

In order to develop reading skills, we ask that the children read as much as possible- this will then be recorded in their reading record. Because the children are in Year 6 and may not read to you, could you please still sign their reading record? We are keeping a record in school and children will be awarded a 'dojo' every time they read.
