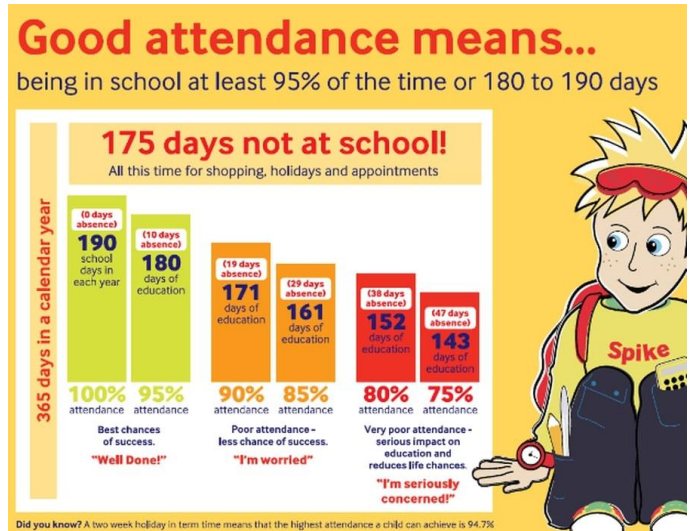
FUN IN THE SUN

Keep safe this summer. Just a reminder that it is recommended that pupils have a wide brimmed or foreign legion style hat which protects the neck.
