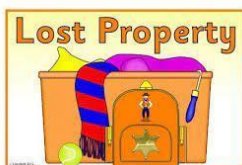
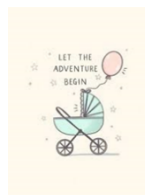
A warm welcome to what is our last newsletter of the academic year. The pace of learning is certainly not dropping in school!

Choking is one of the leading causes of death for children under 3.

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School provides the children with all the equipment they need for lessons so there is no need for them to bring their own pencil cases, pens and pencils into school. As well as them

taking up room on the desks, there is always the chance that they are lost.

We would encourage all children to bring a bookbag with them each day. School ones can be purchased at <https://steadyschoolwear.co.uk/> or you can get non-school ones elsewhere. Books and work tend to get damaged or water leaks on them if they are just in rucksacks etc.

At Patrington Church of England Primary Academy, a high standard of personal appearance is expected of all

pupils. Please find below a list of our school uniform rules and requirements.

- Blue or white shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Royal blue jumper, sweatshirt, or cardigan
- Grey or black trousers, skirt or shorts
- Black sensible styled shoes (completely black, no markings)
- All clothes should be clearly labelled with the child's name.

For Indoor PE

- Plain white T-shirt
- Black PE shorts

For Outdoor PE

As far as possible and with weather permitting, PE will take place outdoors on the field or the playground. Therefore, all children need to ensure they bring the appropriate kit in order to participate in P.E outdoors. This includes:

- Plain white T-shirt and plain black shorts during the Summer Term.
- In Autumn & Winter, suitable warm clothing i.e. black warm top/outdoor tracksuit top and bottoms can be worn.
- Trainers are needed for the field or the playground.

Indoor & Outdoor PE kits should be brought into school in a PE bag on a Monday and left on the child's cloakroom peg until Friday.
