# November 2023 Newsletter



Over the last few weeks we have noticed an increasing number of children not wearing the correct uniform. #### What does our uniform look like?

- Grey or black trousers, shorts, knee length skirt or pinafore.

- Plain black shorts
- Plain black trainers are needed for the field or the playground.
- Black jog suit may be worn in winter for outdoors
